

NOTICE OF LOCAL PUBLIC HEARINGS ON LIBERTY'S ELECTRIC RATES

On May 28, 2021, The Empire District Electric Company d/b/a Liberty filed a general rate request with the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission"). Liberty is seeking in this proceeding to increase its annual gross revenues by \$79.9 million, or approximately 12.15%. If the Commission allows Liberty to recover its Storm Uri costs in Case No. EO-2022-0040, then Liberty will stop seeking to recover them in this case. Removing those costs from this case would reduceLiberty's request by \$29.9 million to \$50.0 million, or approximately 7.61%. As part of this proceeding, Liberty is proposing to increase its fixed residential customer charge from \$13.00 permonth to \$16.00 per month.

Excluding Storm Uri costs, for a residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt-hours of electricity a month, Liberty's proposed increase is approximately \$12.76 each month, or 9.64% percent. If Storm Uri costs are not included, Liberty estimates that the proposed rate increase willhave the following annual bill impacts:
