

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARINGS IN LIBERTY’S WATER AND WASTEWATER RATE CASES

On March 13, 2024, Liberty Utilities (Missouri Water) LLC (“Liberty”) filed a general rate request with the Missouri Public Service Commission (“PSC”). Liberty has requested to increase its annual revenues by an additional \$7,990,089 in annual water revenues (130.37% increase) and an additional \$75,178 in annual wastewater revenues (2.2% increase). The Company is also proposing to consolidate its rates from 17 sets of water rates and 7 sets of wastewater rates into two sets of water rates and two sets of wastewater rates (Bolivar and non-Bolivar). Because of the variety of existing rates, specific impacts will differ by system. A chart showing rate impacts for each water and wastewater system may be found at the end of this Notice.

The PSC will ultimately determine what rate increase, if any, will result. Such rates would not be expected to be effective until early 2025.

Rates for Liberty were last implemented on December 8, 2018. Rates for the former customers of The Empire District Electric Company were last implemented on November 23, 2012. Some systems have not had new rates since they were acquired by Liberty.

Local Public Hearing Information

The PSC is holding public hearings where customers can ask questions and testify about Liberty’s rate request. Customers are encouraged to participate in the hearings.

Each hearing is divided into two parts. In the first part, you may ask questions of Liberty, the Missouri Office of the Public Counsel (“Public Counsel”), and the PSC Staff. The PSC Commissioners and the regulatory law judge will not attend the informal question and answer session. Your questions and the answers provided will not be part of the evidence the PSC reviews. In the second part, PSC Commissioners and a regulatory law judge will be present, and you may testify as part of the official record of the case.
