Preventing frozen pipes

Indoors

- Keep your home temperature set no lower than 55°F.
- If pipes run through cabinets, open the cabinet doors to let warmer room temperatures flow in.
- Keep water moving through the pipes by allowing a small trickle of water to run.
- Eliminate sources of cold air near water lines. Fix drafty windows and plug drafts around doors. Identify your home's freezing points.

Outdoors

- Disconnect hoses and drain the water that remains in faucets.
- · Know the location of and how to shut off your main water valve.



What to do if your pipes freeze

Shut off the water immediately.

Contact a professional plumber who may be able to thaw the pipes with warm air.

Be careful turning the water back on. Once pipes are thawed, slowly turn the water back on and check pipes and joints for any cracks.
